

Birthday Treats and Party Invitations

- Parents may bring birthday treats to school, such as cookies or cupcakes. These items do not have to be store bought, homemade items are acceptable. The items can be served during lunch or at 3:15 in the classroom. After an item is served it is not to leave the cafeteria or classroom, unless it is wrapped. All classroom birthday celebrations must take place between 3:15 and dismissal time so as not to disrupt instructional time. If a student or parent brings other items to celebrate the birthday, such as a prize bag, they will need to be passed out in the classroom so that the items do not become lost at recess. All such items would also be passed out at 3:15.
- Be aware of the food allergies of students in the classroom. Nurse Bowlin is able to help you identify any potential issues.
- Party invitations may be passed out at the end of the school day. Party invitations are only to be passed out at school if all boys are invited, if all girls are invited, or if all of the students in the classroom are invited to the party.
